







## Water's Edge Ministries (formerly Green Lake Lutheran Ministries)

Norman Skarphol, Lake Hanska, and I-Barb Overlie attended the annual meeting on February 10, 2025. We were served a very nice luncheon buffet before the meeting started.

State of the organization was given by Executive Director Travis Aufderheide. 2025 was another busy year for the 3 camps.

Just a few statistics:

187 Ordinary Time participants over a 5 week plus 1 weekend period

86% of the year was filled with retreat ministry activities – 10.2 groups per week

515 -day campers at 15 congregational sites

831 -participants (55 groups) in the Serve Boldly program – 9 partner communities + 133 service organizations. 35 Serve Boldly staff from 10 states & 3 countries

39 -summer camp staff serving 3 camps & 15 day camps from 6 states and 11 countries

Thankfully the annual giving has continued to increase, which includes the annual quilt auction, Dinner Theater, & Waters Edge campaign. Staffing still continues to be a top priority. Most young people can get other summer jobs that pay better. Thankfully the positions have been filled by very capable people.

This year's winner of the "Dave Eliason Advocate of the Year" Award was given to Pastor Ann Rosendale.

It is always fun to visit the camp and hear of the things they are doing. If you have any questions, feel free to contact either Norm or myself.

## **Treasurer's Report:**

January expenses were \$ 9,694.22 and receipts \$11,343.50. We will transfer \$5,000 from the checking account back to the building fund, which was borrowed from over the past years to meet monthly expenses.

## **Trustees Report:**

Ben reported he had a visit with the Grinnell insurance representative. He noted that we needed to bring some of our policies/protocols up to date. Ben shared those items with the council. Since we missed Ash Wednesday, the following is the message you would have heard.

### **Practicing Righteousness**

Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

Tonight's lesson teaches us to do three key elements of righteousness - giving, praying, and doing good. And it stresses that these things are to be done behind the scenes not in a show of publicity or personal approval ratings. Yet isn't it ironic that this is the night when we have ashes rubbed on our foreheads for all to see when we leave this place. But, just like the family who bows their heads in prayer at La Plaza or other restaurants - this isn't being done to draw praise from others or to draw attention to ourselves. It is simply following our love for God.


Our text from the First Nations version of the NT begins with "Beware of doing good just so people can see you" and yet just 9 days ago I spoke about being the salt of the earth and letting your light shine so others can see! Doesn't that seem like an oxymoron? Well, interpreted wrong, it may seem so. But being salt of the earth and being a light to the world was talking about community. These things needed community to be effective. We wish for the community to be seen and recognized for who we are. However, this text is talking about you, me, as singular beings. It is saying that our actions are to be done in secret, reflecting true piety rather than a performance for others.

The point of Jesus' comments is not that religion should always be practiced in private and good deeds kept a secret, but that one should not practice religion or perform good deeds in order to attract positive attention to oneself. Another way to state it is to have righteousness for God, not applause.

Jesus gives some mighty interesting examples of what it means to give, pray and do good privately. He says do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing! When gifts are given to the needy or you fix a neighbor's fence or shovel their sidewalk - don't go bragging about it at the bakery or Embar's - not like others who do that pretending to be what they are not. When you lift up your voice to the Great Spirit - find a hidden, quiet place - do not be like those who stand in the pathways or in a crowd with a loud voice so all can hear. He tells us that if we do these things like giving, praying, fasting or doing good deeds for his sake, we will reap our rewards in heaven. We can leave this earth without a peace prize, or a trophy for the biggest donator, or a certificate of praise for our deeds, knowing we have a greater reward awaiting us in heaven.

Our passage ends with familiar phrasing of "For where you store your valued possessions is where your heart will be." We often misinterpret this message. We think that where we spend our money is what we care about the most. Jesus' point is not that where we put our treasure reveals what sort of people we are, but rather where we put our treasure determines what sort of people we become!

This Lenten season - let us reflect on our actions of praying, giving, fasting, doing good - as our piety and determination to do them for God - not ourselves.

The season of Lent begins as worshipers receive the sign of the + cross on their foreheads and hear again the words from the Ash Wednesday liturgy: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Simple. Humbling. Ominous. Powerful.

As a pastor, I tremble to speak those words.

- You never know if this will be the last time you trace that ashen cross on someone's forehead - because before the next Ash Wednesday, you may stand at their grave and say the words echo it, "Earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust."
- And when a parent comes forward carrying a young child in their arms, I take a breath and pause, wondering whether they really want me to speak those foreboding words over their sweet child.

This year, those words of Ash Wednesday feel all too close and true. Individually, we may not sense it. But the reality of our fragility, mortality, and "dustiness" surrounds us:

- Beloved friends, family members, and church leaders die unexpectedly.
- Congregation members choose conflict over reconciliation or collaboration.
- Our black and brown children and grandchildren carry their passports at all times because - you never know.
- Neighbors who were not born in the U.S. - people of color - suddenly disappear from the restaurants, stores, and farms we know here in greater Minnesota.
- Refugees brought here by our social service organizations are taken away.
- Church members hide away in fear, afraid to go to work or bring their kids to school.
- Teachers struggle to support the students they miss.
- Church members and leaders face criticism as they stand for justice.

You may or may not be experiencing some of those realities yourself. Many out here are afraid to voice our concerns. Some churches seem to have galvanized in recent weeks, while others seem to have grown more divided.

But here is the thing: we need each other. We are church together.

That is not true because we all think the same thoughts or go through the same life experiences. We are church together because Jesus Christ has made it so. Claimed in the name of the + Holy Trinity, we believe that our sins are forgiven and that we are held in God's love forever.

We do not have the same gifts and we do not have to agree on everything, but we are united in living the way of Jesus.

This means that if someone in my church, my community, or community down the road is struggling, it is my calling to love that neighbor in whatever way I can. It means paying attention. It means recognizing that my neighbor's needs are real. We are church together. We bear one another's burdens. And this year, without a doubt, we remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return.

As this reality grounds us, I pray that you will be rooted even more deeply in the promises we hear in the readings for Lent. The promises of:

- the power of God's word;
- salvation for this world God loves so much;
- receiving living water;
- opened eyes that truly see;
- life out of death; and
- a procession of humility, peace, justice, and love.

Even as Lent begins with the familiar words of dust, so it unfolds with God's promises of mercy and steadfast love.

Last year, we began leaning-in to a synod assembly theme focused on "joy." This year, we lean towards "hope." The cross + of Ash Wednesday reflects the cross of Holy Baptism. The ashes may disappear; the cross of baptism remains every day. It may not be visible in a mirror, but it is seen as we "live among God's faithful people, hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper, proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and strive for justice and peace in all the earth." (ELW, Affirmation of Baptism, p. 236).

This Lent, I pray you are sustained by the sure and certain promises of Jesus Christ even as you live in the realities of daily life. St. Paul, writing to the church in Rome, put it like this:

*Do not lag in zeal; be ardent in spirit; serve the Lord.  
Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer.  
Contribute to the needs of the saints; pursue hospitality to strangers.  
(Romans 12:11-13)*


